Cardinal Publishing would like to publish the chapter's next anthology, with the theme being around Indiana landmarks. Tom Doherty said he could promote them through state parks and other landmarks where his company already has books.

The timing and other details are being considered and worked out. Both Janet and Michael have volunteered to edit, depending on the timing of the anthology. No final decision has been made.
